

PURPOSE

This policy is adopted to ensure compliance with New Jersey Public Law 2015, Chapter 220, which supplements Chapter 3B of Title 18A of New Jersey Statutes. The law was approved and became effective on January 19, 2016, as an expansion of the Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act. It requires presidents of public institutions of higher education to regularly report on-campus criminal and fire events to the institution's governing board.

POLICY

The President of Ocean County College, or a designee, shall report to the Ocean County College Board of Trustees, at each of its regular meetings, all crimes, fires, and other emergencies which occurred on campus during the previous reporting period. The report shall include:

1. A count and classification of offenses defined as reportable crimes under the federal Jeanne Clery Act which occurred on campus and which were recorded by campus security and campus or local police departments
2. A list of campus alerts, threats, or emergencies which occurred on campus
3. A count and classification of all fire incidents which occurred on campus and which were recorded by campus security and local fire departments

The President shall report all matters that are not a matter of public record to the Board of Trustees in its executive session, clarifying that such reporting does not render the information a government record available for public inspection under the provisions of Public Law 1963, Chapter 73, commonly known as the Open Public Records Act, or under any other statute, regulation, executive order, or federal law, regulation, or order.
