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Executive Summary

Ocean County College's Environmental Scan is one of many data sources that is utilized by the Institutional Research and Planning division as well as the campus community to inform strategic planning and continuous improvement. The goal of this scan is to offer a detailed look at the many trends and projections of Ocean County College's population and communities that may have an influence on advancing the college's overall mission. The College utilizes this data in order to distinguish important trends and better understand external influences that impact the institution. This can lead to new curricular opportunities and potential challenges to be considered in the planning process.

The Environmental Scan offers the institution comprehensive projections in order to inform future decision making in a wide variety of areas. By compiling past, present, and forecasted data from Ocean County and its neighboring regions, Ocean County College may effectively strengthen its future and successfully advance its strategies and overall mission. Areas reviewed within this Scan include:

- Demographics and Population;
- Labor Markets;
- Income Statistics and Educational Attainment.

Fiscal Year 2024 – Highlights

Population:

- Ocean County’s projected population in 2023 is 688,692 which is an 11.1% increase over the 2021 estimates (620,043). Average population growth rate for Ocean County from 2023 until 2033 is projected to be increasing at a rate of 12.5% every five years.
- Looking at neighboring Monmouth County, the projected population in 2023 is 667,615. This is an 8.1% increase over 2021 estimates (617,680). The average population growth rate for Monmouth County from 2023 until 2033 is projected to be increasing at a rate of 7.5% every five years.
- Overall, the New Jersey statewide population is projected to increase, on average, 7.7% every five years from 2023 to 2033.

Demographics:

- According to the 2023 population estimates, 83.0% of Ocean County is White non-Hispanic, 3.4% is African American non-Hispanic, 2.0% is Asian non-Hispanic, 1.3% are Other Races or Multiracial, and 10.3% is of Hispanic origin.
- Looking at Monmouth County estimates, 74.6% is White non-Hispanic, 6.4% is African American non-Hispanic, 5.7% is Asian non-Hispanic, 1.6% are Other Races or Multiracial, and 11.7% is of Hispanic origin.
- Ocean County population estimates from EMSI for 2033 by race and ethnic origin projects that 79.6% of Ocean County will be White non-Hispanic, 4.1% will be African American non-Hispanic, 2.3% will be Asian non-Hispanic, 1.7% will be Other Races or Multiracial, and 12.4% will be of Hispanic origin.

- Monmouth County population estimates from EMSI for 2033 by race and ethnic origin projects that 73.0% of Monmouth will be White non-Hispanic, 5.6% will be African American non-Hispanic, 6.0% will be Asian non-Hispanic, 1.9% will be Other Races or Multiracial, and 13.5% will be of Hispanic origin.

Economic Information:

- Ocean County’s estimated population at or below the poverty level was 11.4% in 2021, while the state average was slightly lower at 10.2%. In 2012 Ocean County’s unemployment rate peaked at 10.6%, and then decreased to 3.5% in 2019. However, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the unemployment rate spike in 2020 to 9.5% but fell back down to 3.7% in 2022. The state averages for these two years are 9.3% and 3.5%, with the 2020 spike being 9.4% and 2022 being 3.7%. Ocean County’s per-capita income increased from \$43,169 in 2012 to \$57,344 in 2020.
- Monmouth County’s estimated population at or below the poverty level was 7.4% in 2021, well below the state average of 10.2%. The 2012 unemployment rate of 8.7% is the highest it’s been since 2010, but decreased to 3.1% in 2019. However, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the unemployment rate spike in 2020 to 8.5%. Both of these percentages are below the statewide average for those years (9.3% and 3.5%, respectively) as is the 2020 pandemic rate but fell back down to 3.3% in 2022. Alongside the increase in employment was a rise in the per-capita income for Monmouth County: from \$63,233 in 2012 to \$86,091 in 2020.

Occupational Projections:

- There are four industry groups within Ocean County that have projected employment growth from 2023-2033 of three thousand jobs or more. They are the

Social Assistance industry with a 40.5% increase projected in that ten year timeframe (+3,592 jobs), followed by the *Education Services* (30.6%, +3,293), the *Food Services and Drinking Places* industry (22.8%, +3,936), and the *Ambulatory Health Care Services* (18.4%, +3,132).

- Four of the top industries in Monmouth County with greatest projected growth are *Social Assistance* (30.8%, +2,500) followed by *Food Services and Drinking Places* industry (23.1%, +6,547), *Ambulatory Health Care Services* (21.8%, +5,763), and *Nursing and Residential Care Facilities* (14.3%, +1,183).
- Ocean County is projected to have the largest growth from 2023-2033 in the following areas: Occupational Therapy Assistants and Aides (66.5%, +54); Nurse Practitioner (41.1%, +152); Home Health and Personal Care Aides (36.9%, +2,394); Physical Therapist Assistants and Aides (35%, +225); Social Workers (30.8%, +272); and Counselors (29.7%, +612).
- Monmouth County is projected to have the largest growth from 2021-2031 in the following areas: Occupational Therapy Assistants and Aides (69.4%, +45); Nurse Practitioners (58.9%, 427); Physician Assistants (39.5%, +234); Physical Therapist Assistants and Aides (38.3%, 206); Medical and Health Service Managers (29.5%, +445); and Home Health and Personal Care Aides (25.1%, 1,896).
- Looking at Monmouth, Ocean Counties, Burlington, Mercer, Camden and Middlesex counties together, the five occupations projected to have the **largest growth percentage** from 2023-2033 are Occupational Therapy Assistants and Aides (47%), Nurse Practitioners (41%), Home Health and Personal Care Aides

(31%), Physical Therapist Assistants and Aides (31%), and Physician Assistant (30%).

Educational Attainment:

- The educational attainment rates for persons 25 years or older in New Jersey shows that 30.8% of individuals only have a High School Diploma in 2017-2018. This is down from a high of 34.6% in 2001-2002.
- The educational attainment rates for persons 25 or older with either Some College or an Associate Degree is 21.0% in 2017-2018, which is nearly identical to 2001-2002 when 21.2% of individual had that level of educational attainment.
- Finally, the educational attainment rates for persons 25 or older with a Bachelor’s degree is 25.7% in 2017-2018, which is a substantial increase from 20.6% in 2001-2002.

Figure 1.1 – Map of NJ



Figure 1.2 – Ocean County Population Projections by Selected Age Groups: 2023-2033



Figure 1.3 – Ocean County Population Projections by Race/Ethnicity: NJ, 2023-2033



